1.0 Policy:

Examination and procedure rooms will be cleaned/disinfected between patients using a hospital approved disinfectant, such as quaternary ammonia wipe. Sodium hypochlorite wipe will be used if patient has diarrhea.

2.0 Procedure:

- 2.1 Take used instruments out of the room to be cleaned/disinfected.
- **2.2** Change exam tables cover between patients.
- 2.3 Exam tables will be thoroughly cleaned/disinfected daily by EVS using the appropriate disinfecting wipe, quaternary ammonium wipe, sodium hypochlorite wipe, or other hospital approved disinfectant Exam table will be cleaned/disinfected after each use.
- 2.4 Wearing gloves wash the vinyl portion of the examination/procedure table, when visibly soiled, with an approved hospital disinfectant, or germicidal disposable wipe.
 - **2.4.1** Use disposable germicidal wipe (PDI alcohol free wipes or Clorox wipes), and wipe the table.
 - **2.4.2** The wipe should be wet enough with disinfectant to leave the table visibly damp.
 - 2.4.3 Allow the table to air dry for several minutes per manufacturer's recommendation.
 - 2.4.4 Read and follow the label for manufacturer's recommended "contact" or wet time.
- 2.5 Clean/Disinfect equipment (i.e., mayo stands, tables), after every patient/procedure with approved hospital disinfectant.
 - **2.5.1** The equipment must be visibly damp with disinfectant to be properly disinfected.
 - 2.5.2 Allow equipment to air dry or as recommended by the manufacturer.

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3.0 **NOTE:**

The EPA approves hard surface disinfectants for germicidal activity based on manufacture recommendation contact time, meaning that the object is visibly wet with disinfectant according to the manufacture recommended time.

4.0 Workplace Safety:

- 4.1 Use PPE during cleaning of instruments and equipment
- **4.2** Dispose of disposable supplies equipment in regular trash.
- 4.3 Take reusable instruments and soak immediately in enzymatic solution, scrub, dry, and send to central sterile processing when appropriate.
- **4.4** Perform hand hygiene
