

Blood Band Patient ID Wristband Instructions for Use

- These blood bands are used for patients at Kindred Hospital when a "type and screen" and/or "crossmatch is ordered.
- They are only used at Methodist Hospital (in house) when a patient is identified as a "John Doe" or "Jane Doe".
- Please review the directions below about how to fill out the information on the blood band, affix the label to the specimen and apply the band to the patients wrist.



Blood Band Directions

Fill out information on large white label.

Press hard with a ball point pen.








Detach tail with 14 small pre-numbered labels at perforation after last hole.



Draw blood into labeled tube and transport to laboratory.





Before transfusion, compare serial number on blood unit label with number on band. Always check two locations on wristband as carbon copy numbers can become blurred from handling.

Size band around patient's wrist, close plastic snap, and cut off any excess band.



Intended for in-patient use only. For outpatients, use Safeguard #881 with water-resistant protective pocket.
