There is confusion when **Products of Conception** specimens arrive in the lab after Histology is gone. The checklist below will help make sure that all documents are filled out correctly and the specimen is handled appropriately. You will find this checklist in the **Histology Procedure Manual.** 

Please make sure that you are aware of what to do when Products of Conception arrive in the lab.

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## LAB PERSONNEL

<u>Chromosomes requested</u> -- Specimen will be received fresh. If all above is complete, pathologist needs contacted. Pathologist may request specimen be placed in histo fridge for next business day processing by histology (no formalin to be added).

<u>NO chromosomes requested</u> – Formalin can be added, or can be placed in histo fridge (if okayed by pathologist) and formalin will be added when histology returns.
