Leadership

What ROPs are included in the Leadership Standard? The Leadership Standard clarifies requirements for effective operational and performance management supports, decision-making structures, and infrastructure needed to drive excellence and quality improvement.

Key Leadership sections:

- Creating and sustaining a caring culture → Services are co-designed with clients and families, partners, and the community. *Risk Incident Reporting (RL6)* facilitates a documented and coordinated approach to prevent conflict.
 - a. <u>Workplace Violence Prevention (ROP 2.12</u>) provides procedures to confidentially report incidents of workplace violence.
- Planning and designing services → Ensures policies and procedures are in place for all aspects of dealing with client files and records.
- 3. Allocating resources and building infrastructure → Ensuring your team is prepared and possessing all required training and education, and that organizational resources are monitored and managed. As part of the Enterprise Risk Management Framework:
 - a. <u>Preventative Maintenance Program (ROP 9.8</u>) ensures medical devices, equipment and technology are safe and functional; and
 - b. <u>Patient Safety Education and Training (ROP 10.9</u>) addresses specific patient safety focus areas, available to all individuals in an organization.
- Monitoring and improving quality and safety → Using current research, evidence-informed guidelines, and best practice information to improve the quality of services.
 - a. Understanding patterns of demand and developing strategies to reduce barriers to <u>Client Flow (ROP</u> <u>13.4</u>);
 - b. Patient Safety Plan (ROP 15.1, 15.11) ensures services are provided safely;
 - c. <u>Patient Safety Incident Management (ROP 15.4</u>) addresses urgent care, reporting incidents, and reducing the risk of imminent recurrences;
 - d. <u>Patient Safety Incident Disclosure (ROP 15.6</u>) provides documented approach to disclosing patient incidents to clients and families; and
 - e. <u>Medication Reconciliation as a Strategic Priority</u> (ROP 15.7) ensures accurate information about medications across care transitions. Working with clients and families to generate a Best Possible Medication History (BPMH).
