1. STAT Days:

- One person should not work alone since the core lab is no longer here past 3
- We will have 2 12 to 8 techs on these days so no one is alone
- 2. Changing urine bench to 12 to 8:
 - Would mean we would always have 2 12 to 8 techs in the week
 - This would be better for the urine bench so the chromogenic agar can incubate longer before being read
