

## **Microbiology Meeting Minutes**

March 15, 2023 12:15 to 12:45

#### 1. Vitek ID:

- Vitek ID isn't always right, even if the percentage is good
- The Vitek looks at the biochemical reactions and matches the results with an organism in the database
- Technically an E.coli could be run on a GPI card and give a results of S.aureus with a good ID
- Make sure to use the Bacteriology SOP to help with ID
- Look for clues. If a GNB doesn't grow on MAC, it is something uncommon. Use the charts

### 2. CMPT/CAP/QASI PCCOV:

- When you scan the LIS barcode into the GX for these samples, it will not accept them
- Laura S thinks it could be because of the Study box that is checked
- For now, enter the accession number manually and this will work
- Laura S will investigate further

## 3. Changes:

- C.diff weekly QC will be done on Wednesdays by the Wednesday QC tech
  - This is to solve the problem of no tech on the front bench on Mondays
- Vitek 2 monthly maintenance will be done on the first Wednesday of the month by the Wednesday QC tech
  - > This is to alleviate the work on the wound bench and is also better as we will do QC after the maintenance
- Mouth and Yeast cultures will now be done on the urine bench.
  - > This is to alleviate some of the work on the wound bench and to give a bit more work to the urine bench

# 4. Cell phones in the laboratory:

- Laura S has been told by other supervisors that there are cell phones being used at the benches
- This should not be happening. It is an infection control risk and also, we are supposed to be working at our bench not on our phones
- If you need to take a call while you are working, clean your hands and then take your phone out of the lab
- If you do use your phone before you wash your hands, make sure to clean your phone after since it is potentially contaminated



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# 5. Weekly GX MTB testing:

- This has begun now
- Laura S worked with Chelsea this week and will work with Jen next week. Slowly, everyone will be shown. It is easier to show then explain
- There are 3 controls-negative, MTB positive Rifampin sensitive and MTB positive Rifampin resistant
- They are run and documented on the QC results record just like the other PCR tests

### 6. PCR QC results records:

- Please continue to place the in use or completed PCR QC results records in the black binder
- Laura S put blank sheets in the blue binder. It is just to store the blank sheets not to store used sheets

#### 7. Sample racks

- New green swab racks have been ordered to replace the small red ones
- They are big enough for urine samples as well (blue and grey tops)
- The orange top urines still need to go in the fridge when done
- This will make plating easier as you will not have to move the planted urines to the fridge bucket every time you plant

#### 8. Penicils:

- Same with Sharpies. If they are not working anymore, throw them out and get a new one

#### 9. Methanol:
