## Subject: Sepsis Protocol

## Critical Lab Process Notification for:

Phlebotomy, Specimen Processing AND Technical Staff

Effective date:	10/1/2015
Protocol:	<b>Sepsis Policy</b> Plan for early recognition AND intervention of patients identified with sever sepsis and septic shock.
Why:	<ul> <li>Major healthcare problem killing one in four</li> <li>Speed &amp; appropriateness of identification and therapy in first initial hours after severe sepsis develops influences outcome</li> <li>Can result in acute organ dysfunction</li> </ul>
Actions Required:	<ul> <li>Nursing - Quick identification of sepsis</li> <li>Phlebotomists - draw STAT lactate in a timely manner</li> <li>Specimen Processing - immediate receipt of all STAT Lactate tests.</li> <li>Technical staff immediate resulting of lactate test and immediate notification of critical lactate of ≥ 2.0 mmol/L to RN</li> <li>Nursing – if phlebotomist does not respond in 15 minutes, nursing will call the Lab.</li> <li>Lab staff taking follow up call from nursing for a STAT Lactate not collected in 15 minutes <i>MUST ESCALATE</i> the notification to a group lead, Tech in Charge, Supervisor or Manager to achieve the draw as quickly as possible.</li> </ul>
Emergency Dept. & ICU	STAT lactates on patients in the Emergency Dept. & ICU will be performed via Point of Care iSTAT by Emergency Dept. staff or Respiratory Therapy.
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
