# LABORATORY ALERT

**Subject: Manual Result Entry in Sunquest**

The Laboratory is informing you of the following:

## Things to remember when entering results manually into Sunquest using **Function: MEM**

It is important that you type in the **worksheet code** for the test you are resulting. Worksheets may have

A. Calculations and rules associated with them that:

- Tag a result with CRIT or CALL
- Adjust results for upper/lower CRR

B. Default Method codes (could be for an instrument or a manual method)

- Important for CAP surveys and result transmission to CAP
- Pay attention to the **default method code**. This indicates the instrument or method used in testing. You will be PROMPTED TO CHANGE THE METHOD, IF NEEDED.

Remember:

- Abnormal results are noted as FAILED NORMAL
- Critical results are noted as FAILED VERIFY

If you do NOT know the Worksheet code:

1. In SmarTerm, go to function **MIQ**, option **1**.
2. At the TEST CODE: prompt, **type in the order code**. If you don't know the code, you can type an "=" and part of the order (test) name.
3. Worksheets consist of two parts: Worksheet code, column # (you can ignore column #)

**Note:** SGMC worksheets start with the letter S  
 WOMC worksheets start with the letter W  
 GEC worksheets start with the letter G

The worksheet name can be found under the "WS" header (if order is a battery) or WORKSHEET: if order is an individual order).
