<p>Technical Staff Update:</p>	<p>Women’s Hospital Phlebotomy Team and Laboratory Staff must recognize Type and Screen orders with a TAT2HR priority as needing to be <u>collected, received in lab, tested and resulted within 2 hours.</u></p> <p>If blood bank techs are unable to complete testing within the expected 2 hour TAT because of antibody problems or special blood needs, techs should inform the patient’s caregiver. Document in a BB comment the name of the informed caregiver, the date, time, and tech initials.</p> <p>Also provide the caregiver with an approximate time testing should be completed and blood products available if needed.</p> <p>Other Cone Health campuses: The TAT2HR priority is intended for OB Type and Screens ordered at Women’s Hospital however if a Type and Screen order with a TAT2HR priority is encountered at another Cone Health laboratory, Phlebotomy staff and blood bank staff should recognize the TAT2HR priority, collect and complete testing within 2 hours.</p> <p>See attachment 1: LIS specimen label showing a Type and Screen ordered with TAT2HR priority.</p> <p>See attachment 2: CHL Clips and Notes about TAT2HR priority</p>
