## Process Change for Type and Screen Collection and Transfusion for the Neonate

Beginning April 28th.

- We will no longer need to complete the banding process when obtaining a type and screen for the neonate.
- The process for labeling the specimen when obtaining a type and screen for a neonate will be the same as other lab collections.
- We will also begin to transfusing neonates (<4 months) with CMV negative, Irradiated RBCs.
- All neonates <4 months will receive only O Negative units unless approved by the medical director.
- Units given to neonates <4 months do not require crossmatching

These changes are being made In an effort to provide consistency across the service line while also providing great care to our patients.
