URINE COLLECTION, MEASUREMENT, AND ALIQUOT FOR TIMED SPECIMENS

Administrative Procedure 545.F

PURPOSE:

To establish standardized 24-hour urine collection and processing procedures for the all UCDHS Clinical Laboratory sites.

STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES:

- Patient should avoid alcoholic beverages and vitamins for at least 24 hours before starting to collect urine, and during collection period. Patient should not discontinue medications unless instructed to do so by the physician.
- 2 Patient should not exceed normal intake of liquids or change dietary habits during the day before and the day of the collection unless the physician gives specific instructions to do otherwise.
- 3. On the day of collection, the patient should discard the first morning void and begin the collection after this void. Document date and time, this is the start date and time.
- 4. Collect <u>all</u> urine for the next 24 hours. The final void on the second morning should be collected at the same <u>time</u> the collection was started the previous day. This is the final collection added to the 24-hour urine sample.
- 5. Keep the urine <u>refrigerated</u> during and after completion of collection.
- 6. Preservative maybe added to this container if required for the test requested after the collection is completed and returned to the lab. Patients will not be provided containers containing any caustic material, such as acid.
- 7. Document patient <u>height and weight</u>.
- 8. DOCUMENT START AND FINISH DATE / TIME OF COLLECTION.
- 9. At the time the specimen container is issued, the patient needs to be given verbal and written instructions on collecting 24-hour urine specimens
