ODHL Laboratory Preparedness – Policy Statement

Purpose: This policy has been developed to ensure that the Ohio Department of Health Laboratory (ODHL) is prepared to provide laboratory support for public health emergencies.

Principle: The State of Ohio Emergency Operations Plan has tasked the ODHL to perform laboratory testing and confirmation of samples during public health emergencies. As a result, the ODHL must have systems in place to ensure that the laboratory will be able to maintain 24/7 operations to assist with testing or triaging of specimens received during public health emergency situations. Public health emergencies may include the receipt of biological, chemical and/or radiological specimens.

- 1. The ODHL will ensure 24/7 operations are available to respond to emergency situations by having trained supervisors and staff available for consultation as well as testing services.
- 2. The ODHL will maintain the appropriate accreditations, certifications and/or licensures necessary to ensure 24/7 preparedness to accept, test, and report results from specimens received during public health emergencies.
- 3. The ODHL will maintain the appropriate equipment, supplies, and staffing levels to ensure 24/7 preparedness to test or triage specimens received during public health emergencies.
- 4. If the ODHL is unable to accept, test, and report specimens internally in a 24/7 capacity, contracts, MOAs/MOUs, or mutual assistance agreements will be in place to ensure 24/7 preparedness during public health emergencies.
