


Medical directors of each Department of Laboratory Medicine laboratories reappropriations responsibility for performing

- Interaction with agencies such as national, state and local health departments, as appropriate, for laboratory-related matters.

And all other duties assigned to the laboratory Director in any College of American Pathologists (CAP) checklists that may be delegated to:
