STCVHA SOP FM-02.06 RESPIRATORY PROTECTION PROGRAM

ANNUAL EDUCATION

PROCESS:

- 1. All duties within SCVHA have been evaluated for potential hazards.
- NIOSH approved personal protective equipment (PPE) has been selected to protect the employee performing those duties, as outlined in <u>SOP FM-</u> 02.05 Personal Protective Equipment.
- 3. Staff requiring respiratory protection will be medically cleared by occupational health prior to being fit-tested and trained on the proper use and care of the equipment.
- 4. Staff receive fitting and training annually or as needed:
 - a. New duties may require new PPE, clearance and fitting
 - b. New clearance may be required for shortness of breath symptoms experienced while using the PPE, or if the employee experiences changes in cardiac or respiratory medical conditions.
 - c. New fit testing is recommended for physical changes such as facial injuries or surgeries, dental procedures or weight change of more than 20 pounds.
- 5. Staff inspect PPE prior to donning, check fit and function after donning, and clean or dispose of PPE after doffing.

EXPECTED HAZARDS:

BIOLOGIC: Infectious diseases may be transmitted through the air. When engineering controls do not prevent transmission, staff may be required to wear air-purifying respirators during close care with Veterans, especially when performing aerosolizing procedures. See Infection Prevention policies, procedures, precautions signs and <u>SharePoint</u> for details.

HAZARDOUS DRUGS: Handling some hazardous drugs requires respiratory protection, as noted on the <u>Hazardous Drug Assessment of Risk</u> worksheet.
