

PROCEDURE FOR HANDING OUT A 24 HOUR URINE CONTAINER

PRINCIPLE

To prevent tests from populating the pending log prior to the member returning the specimen, 24 hour urines will be dispatched when the specimen is returned. To properly identify the specimen, a label will be placed on the specimen with required information.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS

- 24 hour urine containers
- 24 hour urine acid-washed containers for heavy metal collections
- 24 hour urine labels

PROCEDURE

- 1. Check ORV for the tests requested
- 2. Fill out the label completely, including the tests that are being requested
 - Write your NUID and location where you are handing out the container.
- 3. Place the label on the 24 hour urine container
- 4. Give the member instructions for collecting the specimen

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LIMITATIONS OF THE PROCEDURE

It is important to accurately write the name of the 24 hour urine tests on the label in order to provide the information needed when the member returns. If the tests are not accurately written down, whoever receives the specimen when the member returns may not collect blood required as part of the collection (i.e. creatinine clearance).

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
